- Methods of teaching have shifted to student centric, so classes became more interactive.
- Power point presentations are made with the help of ICT facilities to make the teaching effective.
- Documentary films related to current topics are conducted to wider students thinking.
- Assignments, project report, practical work helped students to encourage practical learning.
- Scholarships, Remedial coaching, and Internet facility provided to students for wider reference.
- Students are encouraged to refer library books, internet, journals etc. to learn.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

One internal exams are conducted as per the directions of the university as part of continuous evaluation. Class tests are regularly conducted. Apart from this, presentations and assignments are also used as part of continuous evaluation. Additional coaching is provided to needy students. This takes the form of remedial teaching. The faculty makes use of every opportunity to advance their knowledge by participating in seminars and through presentation of papers. They also encourage the students to do the same

6.3.4 Research and Development

Faculty members are motivated to involve in minor research programmes of UGC and ICSR. Faculty members are taking part in seminars and conferences. They have published research papers in various reputed journals. Minor projects have been sanctioned to the Departments of Commerce and Punjabi. The physics faculty has attended post-doctoral research programmes in the United States. Departments of the college also conduct UGC and ICSR sponsored seminar. Many faculty members of different departments are pursuing Ph.D.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Various subject experts are invited to share their experiences with the faculty to encourage them and to increase their efficiency. The initiatives like Faculty Development Programmes and Teaching-Learning Programmes are organised by the college.

These initiatives encourage the faculty for research work and help them to publish it in renowned journals and magazines as well as to sharpen their teaching skills too. Our faculty regularly enrol into refresher courses and orientation programmes etc.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The recruitment of teaching and administrative staff is done as per the norms laid down by the UGC, Panjab University and Panjab Government. The notice of recruitment is advertised through the regional and national newspapers.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The college organises various industrial tours to the industries like Shakunt Enterprises Ludhiana and Ram Tech etc. Through these industrial tours students come to know about the practical implementation of the theoretical knowledge. It helps them to understand the future perspectives of their subject. College also invites various experts for interaction with students regarding their careers. Students learn a lot from such industrial tours and discussions with experts to become creative and employment ready.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Admission of students is made as per the University and Panjab Government norms. Students are admitted on merit basis where the seats are limited. Admission notice is published in various leading newspapers before starting every academic session. The college follows the Punjab University/ Punjab Government reservation policy for all classes with regards to various categories such as SC/ST/OBC/Freedom Fighters/ Defence Personnel and Ex-servicemen/ Kashmiri Migrants/ differently abled/Sports persons, Dingle Girl Child etc.
